Shapiro Public Service Award

The J.B. and Maurice C. Shapiro Public Service Awards have been established at GW to support and encourage students who wish to pursue voluntary public service, recognizing that the need to earn income to support their education during the academic year and summer may be an obstacle for some.

Eligible public service may include work for any private non-profit organization or any institution or agency of federal, state, or local government. The public service must be performed in the United States.

The recipients must undertake this work without compensation for at least 300 hours in total between May and September. The public service may be in Washington, D.C.. or the student's hometown. First-year students, sophomores, and juniors are eligible.

Deadline: April 16, 2021
