Students from CCAS and SEAS are launching a fundraiser to provide humanitarian aid to Ukrainian refugees and internally displaced persons. By the end of March 2022, more than 10 million Ukrainians have been displaced, creating a massive humanitarian crisis in Eastern Europe. 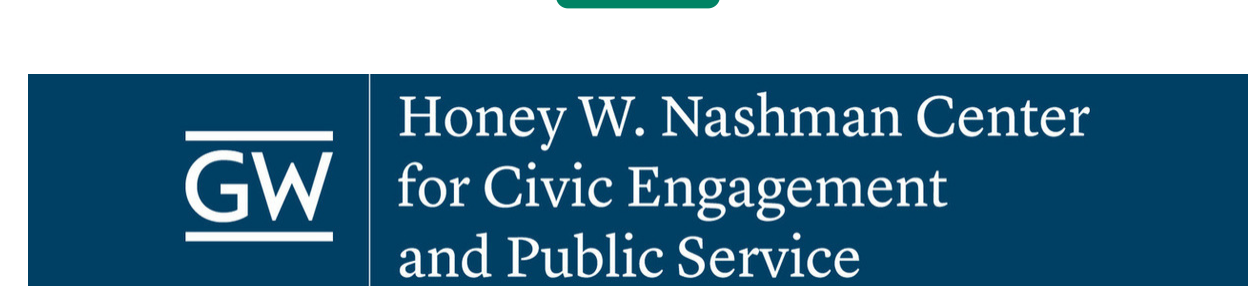
