## **Keep Up With Georgia Senate Election Runoff**

Here is a quick guide on what the Georgia Senate Election Runoff is and how to vote if you are preregistered or registered for Georgia.

There are 3 ways you can vote:

- 1. Early voting, starting Nov. 26 or 28 (varies by county)
- 2. Absentee/Mail-In Ballot: Mail your ballot by Nov. 28
- 3. In person on election day on 12/6/22 before 7 pm EST


#### Apply for the Montgomery County Council Fellows Program

Highlights of the Program:


