### Bicentennial Celebration

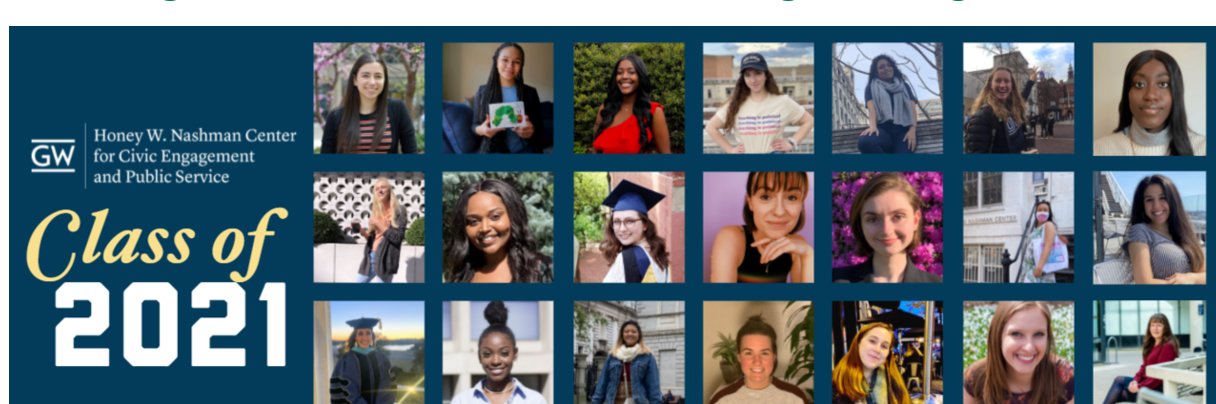
